

Adebisi, a culinary and sustainability expert, shared insights on sustainable practices across the food supply chain, from seed selection to dining, emphasizing food safety, waste reduction, and environmental impact mitigation.

COP-AFRICA

• On October 15, 2024, the IMAGES Initiative, in partnership with the Carbon Offset Programme - Africa (COP-Africa), hosted a webinar titled "Indigenous Trees as Sources of Economic Opportunity & Climate Resilience." The event, moderated by Sope Afolayan featured Olukunle Olasupo from the IITA Forest & Vegetable Centre as the guest speaker. The discussion centered on the economic, environmental, and medicinal benefits of indigenous trees. Participants learned about the potential of native trees to support carbon credit generation, improve soil fertility, control erosion, and provide non-timber products such as honey, vegetables, and medicinal plants. The webinar also explored sustainable forestry practices, the role of indigenous trees in urban greening, and their contribution to climate resilience. Attendees were encouraged to develop local and international markets for indigenous products, start home gardens, and partner with organizations like the IITA Forest Center for urban tree planting initiatives. 

Abstract/Description

This paper presents a novel framework for assessing resilience in food systems, focusing on three dynamic metrics: return time, magnitude of deviation, and recovery rate.
